The Business (ex Pro) license also includes full functionality. The license allows commercial use of the software. It's intended for organizations, institutions, and individuals that derive a profit from the usage of the software.

Also, the new version includes the Vibrance adjustment that allows users to increase the intensity of muted colors in a photo and leave the already well-saturated colors, the updated NatureArt built-in plugin, as well as many optimizations and improvements.

The image editor is available for download at <u>alivecolors.com</u>. The trial period includes 10 days of fully functional use.

AliveColors runs on Windows 7, 8, 8.1, 10, 11 and on Mac OS X 10.10-10.11, macOS 10.12-12.0, 64-bit. It is also compatible with Linux (via Wine). The program supports a multi-language interface configurable at any time by switching in the program preferences.

Besides the free version, the program comes in Home (\$55) and Business (\$160) lifetime licenses, both are fully functional. Alternatively, users can choose an annual subscription.
